

Listening, Attention and Understanding

Home Learning Challenges

Help out with a task at home, such as cooking a simple meal, baking a cake, setting the table or making your bed. Listen to the instructions your grown-up gives you and ask questions about how you can help and what needs doing. How did you help?



Read a story with a grown-up. Talk about the story events and the different characters in the story. What was your favourite part of the story and why? Ask your grown-up what their favourite part of the story was and ask them to tell you why they liked that part best.

Talk about a special event that you have done recently. What can you remember? Can you ask your friend or a grown-up about something they have done recently? Listen carefully to what they say and ask questions to find out more information.

On your way home from school, talk about the things that you see and notice. Can you ask someone in your family what they saw on their way home? Ask them questions to find out more, such as 'What colour were the flowers?' or 'What different animals did you notice?'

Visit a local library and look at a selection of books, including non-fiction. Explore new vocabulary and ask questions about what you have heard. Can you tell your grown-up a new word or fact that you have learned?



When out and about with your family, engage in conversation with familiar adults, such as local shop workers, school crossing patrol or the doctor. You could ask them questions, such as 'What has made you smile today?' or 'How are you feeling today?'
